



Academic and Behavioral Probation Policy

In keeping with the Jr. Beta Pledge, that sets forth a standard of academic and behavioral excellence, all students must keep their grades above a 93% overall average and maintain a behavioral record free of office referrals. If such a time comes where a student fails to meet these requirements, the following will take place.

Academic Probation:

If a student falls below a 93% average on their quarterly report card, they will be placed on academic probation. They will have one quarter to bring their average to a 93% or higher. If they do so, they will once again be a member in good standing. If they do not, they will be removed from the Beta roster and will have to wait until the next year to be inducted back into Beta, given they have met the criteria.

While a student is on academic probation she/he will still be able to participate in Beta Club events and must still meet the club's service hour and behavior requirements.

Behavioral Probation:

If a student receives a office referral for disciplinary purposes, they will be placed on behavioral probation for the rest of the year. If the student receives an additional office referral while on probation, they will be removed from the Beta roster for a period of two years. If, at the end of that time period, they have proven themselves to be once again eligible for Beta membership, they may be invited to rejoin the SeA chapter.

While a student is on behavioral probation she/he will still be able to participate in Beta Club events and must still meet the club's service hour and academic requirements.

The SeA Beta Club reserves the right to remove any student from the roster for first time referrals in the event that the sponsor and principal deem the infraction to be of a severe nature that warrants immediate action.
