Dear SeA Parents and Guardians,

Good morning. I hope this email finds you and your family well. As most of you have seen, Governor Roy Cooper has mandated schools remain closed with online learning taking place until the last day of school. Southeastern Academy's last day is May 22, 2020.

In grades K-5, students will not receive a final grade. Grades will end as of the 3rd 9 weeks. Students/Parents will receive feedback on their report cards about student growth during the last 9 weeks.

In grades 6-8, students will receive a Pass, "P19," or Withdrawal, "WC19," for final course grades. "P19" will be assigned to any student who was meeting expectations and passing the course as of March 13. A "WC19" will be assigned to any student who was not passing the course as of March 13 and who was unable to improve to the point of passing the course through remote learning opportunities. Students/Parents will receive feedback on their report cards about student growth during the last 9 weeks.

No child will be retained unless you have already been notified by letter from your child's teacher. If you have questions about this, please contact your child's homeroom teacher.

It is very important that your child continue their remote learning until the last day of school. Next year, he/she will still be expected to know the standards in their current grade. Just because they are not returning to the school building, does not mean that their learning stops. Teachers will continue to provide remote learning until the last day of school.

We will be providing a schedule of when students can return their books to school and pick up any remaining items from their classroom. This will take place during the week of May 18-22. Please be on the lookout for an email regarding the schedule.

Ending the school year virtually is very disheartening for us. The SeA staff misses the students and greatly wishes things were back to normal. The staff appreciates all of your efforts to make sure your children are online and doing their work. This is a challenging time and your efforts have not gone unnoticed.
